Rules & Regulation of Premiums and Exhibits

By entering an item or animal for exhibit, the person exhibiting said item agrees to abide by the following general rules and procedures. Failure to do so may result in forfeiture of premiums and possible removal from the fairgrounds.

In addition, the exhibitor and his/her exhibit(s) must comply with all health and department/section-specific rules listed under the appropriate headings in this Premium Book.

General Rules & Regulations

1. Exhibit space must be paid in full by the dates listed in each department.
2. All expense of transportation and transfer to the space allotted must be paid by the owner. The Association cordially invites dealers to exhibit their products.
3. All articles on exhibit must be respected as private property and any person detected in purloining or injuring them will be dealt with according to law.
4. This Association assumes no responsibility in cases of loss or damage to stock or other exhibits, from any cause. In case anyone is injured, the privilege renter or exhibitor shall assume all responsibility, therefore, and shall indemnify the Fair for any and all expenses occasioned by such an accident or injury.
5. Exhibitors are required to give personal attention to their property and animals and at the close of the Fair to see to their removal; only on this condition are entries received and the Association will not assume any liability for personal injury sustained by any person entering the grounds. All persons renting privileges upon the ground and all exhibitors of livestock, machinery, etc., must so attend to their removal as the Association will not assume further responsibility.
6. A penalty will be imposed on exhibitors who knowingly exhibit diseased stock.
7. No disorderly conduct of any kind will be permitted. A police force will be upon the grounds to prevent inappropriate behavior and see that all rules and regulations are strictly observed.
8. The management appreciates all courtesies from members of the press, local and from other town and cities, and will be glad to meet with any who may find it convenient to attend the Fair. Admission will be cheerfully furnished to publishers, editors and chosen representatives presenting proper credentials to the office.
9. The Fair Association will not be responsible for typographical errors.
10. No alcoholic beverages, drugs, or other controlled substances are permitted on the fairgrounds by the public, workers or entertainers. Exhibitors using alcohol will have their premium money withheld and their exhibit will be sent home.
11. Anyone not exhibiting livestock at the Fair will not be permitted on the fairgrounds between midnight and 6:00 AM unless they have a special permit from the fair office.
12. Livestock and Dairy trailers and trucks being parked on the fairgrounds during the week should be parked at the west end of the lot beyond the tractor pull area (Gate 7).

DAIRY DEPARTMENT

Dairy Cattle Health Rules

The Shippensburg Fair Association has designated the Burnt Mill Veterinary Center as the official fair veterinarians.

IMPORTANT: ALL HEALTH PAPERS MUST BE CHECKED BEFORE UNLOADING.

Be sure to use only grooming products that are approved for use on meat and dairy animals when fitting your animals for show. Unapproved products may contain ingredients that result in unacceptable residues in the meat or milk. If you are not certain that a product is residue safe and approved for use on meat or dairy animals, **do not use it!** **Important! - If upon slaughter, treatment with drugs, biologics or any chemical from fitting products is the cause of condemnation of a carcass, the loss of the carcass and any other damages will be borne by the exhibitor.**

HEALTH CERTIFICATION

No animal showing evidence of contagious, infectious, or external parasitic disease shall be allowed entrance into the show. All animals must be accompanied by an approved Health Certificate and bear unique permanent identification. The base date for computing health rules will be the opening day of the show. Animals will not be admitted without the necessary health papers. Health Certificate must be available at all times as additional inspections of Health Certificates will be made.

ALL CATTLE MUST HAVE AN OFFICIAL EARTAG OR OFFICIAL TATTOO.

PENNSYLVANIA CATTLE

No Tuberculosis test is required. – No Brucellosis test is required.

VACCINATION REQUIREMENT

All cattle must be accompanied by a health certificate, signed by an accredited veterinarian, that includes a statement that the animals(s) identified have been immunized against IBR, P13, and BVD. Animals that have never been vaccinated against BVD or have not been vaccinated against BVD during the previous 12 months must receive one dose of modified live virus vaccine given at least 15 days, and not more than 180 days before the show, or two doses of killed vaccine, two to four weeks apart, with the last dose given at least 15 days and not more than 180 days before the show. Animals that have been vaccinated against BVD within the previous 12 months must receive at least a single injection of modified live virus or killed vaccine given not less than 15 days and not more than 180 days before the show. **IMPORTANT: The date of the last live virus vaccination or the dates of the last two killed virus vaccinations must be recorded on the Health Certificate.** Hyperimmune serum may not be used as a substitute for the above vaccination requirement. No animals will be admitted to the show unless these requirements have been met.

RABIES VACCINATION REQUIREMENT

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!

A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age or older. All vaccine label directions must be followed, and all rabies vaccinated cattle must be accompanied by a rabies vaccine certificate or the vaccination information must be included on the CVI. If a rabies vaccination certificate is provided, the certificate must contain legible name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine and the veterinarian's signature. A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable.

OUT-OF-STATE CATTLE

An interstate health certificate recording the required tests and stating the animals have not been exposed to any infectious, contagious, or parasitic disease shall be signed by an accredited veterinarian approved by the State Veterinarian of the state of origin and forwarded to the Pennsylvania Bureau of Animal Health and Diagnostic Services.

TUBERCULOSIS REQUIREMENTS – A tuberculosis test is required. **BRUCELLOSIS REQUIREMENTS** – No test is required for animals originating from states classified as Brucellosis Free and animals originating from Class A, B or C states should call (717) 783-9550 for current interstate brucellosis test requirements.

Dairy Cattle Rules

1. All applications for entry must be made on printed forms with payment of entry fee and mailed to John Ocker III, 770 Mud Level Road, Shippensburg, PA 17257, no later than **July 10, 2011**. No additional entries will be accepted after this date. Holstein and Ayrshire entries will be limited to 200 animals, and colored breeds limited will also be limited to 200 animals. Entries will be accepted on a first-received basis. All applications received and accepted by the committee will receive a Letter of Acceptance. **Entry fee \$3.00 per animal for Youth - \$6.00 for all others.**
2. The Fair Association and Dairy Committee have the right to accept or reject any or all entries.
3. **Stall Assignments – Two (2) stalls we be given to each Holstein and Brown Swiss Cow, and three stalls will be given to every two colored breed cows.**
4. **Scratch Fee – a \$25 scratch fee will be assessed to exhibitors that fail to scratch an animal before the scratch deadline. The scratch deadline is July 14, 2011 for Ayrshires, Brown Swiss, Guernseys, Jerseys, and Milking Shorthorns. The Holstein scratch deadline is July 18, 2011. All scratch fees are due prior to the receipt of Shippensburg Community Fair premium checks. The Shippensburg Community Fair Dairy Committee retains final ruling on all scratch fees.**
5. **Substitution Rule – An exhibitor is permitted to substitute any animal for another within the same breed. Substitution can be a cow for a calf or vice versa.**
6. Certification of Registration must be in exhibitor's name and available to show management when animals are checked into the show. If Certificate of Registry is not in the exhibitor's name at the time of the show, then the animal may be eligible to be shown if a signed transfer with payment attached when animals are checked into the show.
7. All feed, bedding, and necessary utensils for proper care of animals shall be provided by the exhibitor.
8. All assigned stalls and animals shall be kept in a neat and presentable condition at all times. Failure to comply will result in forfeiture of prize money.
9. Any exhibitor displaying disorderly conduct or using alcohol on the fairgrounds will be dismissed from the fair and premiums withheld.
10. When there are fewer entries in any class than the number of premiums offered, the Judges may, at their discretion, award a prize of such grade as the animal deserves.
11. While the Shippensburg Community Fair will do everything in their power to protect animals on exhibit, they will not be responsible for injuries incurred.

Special Rules

1. **Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, Jersey, and Milking Shorthorn shall be in their assigned stall by 12:00 Noon on Sunday, July 24, 2011. All Holstein cattle must arrive between 8:00 AM and 2:00 PM on Wednesday, July 27, 2011.**
2. Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, Jersey, and Milking Shorthorn animals are permitted to be unloaded any time after 8:00 AM on Sunday, July 24, 2011.
3. **Judging of Ayrshires, Brown Swiss, Guernseys, and Milking Shorthorns is scheduled for 10:00 AM on Tuesday, July 26, 2011. The Jersey Show will begin at 6:00 PM.**
4. On Friday, July 29, 2011, the judging of Holsteins will commence at 6:00 PM.
5. Ayrshires, Brown Swiss, Guernseys, Jerseys, and Milking Shorthorns will be released after the completion of the Jersey Show on Tuesday, July 26, 2011 and must be off the grounds by 12:00 Midnight. All Holsteins will be released at the conclusion of the Holstein Show on Friday, July 29, 2011 and must be off the grounds by 1:00 AM on Saturday, July 30, 2011.
6. Any exhibitor living outside Cumberland or Franklin counties may leave one hour early at the discretion of the Show Chairman.
7. All exhibitors must clean up outside in front of their assigned stalls before departing. Satisfactory work must be done.
8. **The Shippensburg Community Fair asks all exhibitors to NOT USE NEWSPAPER, SAWDUST OR SHAVINGS FOR BEDDING. The Fair is using a mushroom mulch vendor to take manure away. Peanut hulls, straw and corn cobs may be used. We regret any inconvenience.**
9. **For the 2011 Shippensburg Community Fair, the "Youth" category will replace both 4-H and FFA. A Youth is defined as any exhibitor that is under the age of 21 and a current member of 4-H, FFA, or any breed youth organization.**
10. All Youth members must designate on the entry blank all animals that will be shown as Youth. All Youth animals exhibited are eligible to receive premiums for all animals entered in Youth. The Dairy Committee asks that all Youth animals be shown by Youth members and also in the championship classes. Any Youth exhibitor will be guaranteed a \$5.00 minimum.
11. All Youth animals will be judged in conjunction with open classes.
12. Youth animals may be entered in both open and Youth. Only one entry fee is to be paid.
13. Anyone not exhibiting livestock at the fair will not be permitted on the grounds between 12:00 Midnight and 6:00 AM, unless they have a special permit from the Fair Office.
14. Livestock and Dairy trailers and trucks being parked on the fairgrounds during the week should be parked at the west end of the lot beyond the tractor pull area (Gate 7).
15. Prize money and points toward Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor Awards will be limited to two (2) animals per class.
16. Parking passes will be limited to no more than two (2) passes per exhibitor, with not more than three (3) per family. Distribution of passes will be given at the discretion of the Dairy Committee Chairman.
17. When all type shows begin, there will be no additional corrections or changes made in the official catalog.
18. **THE SHIPPENSBURG COMMUNITY FAIR WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR TYPOGRAPHICAL ERRORS.**

Premier Awards

Premier Awards - total points will be determined by the six (6) highest point animals for both Premier Breeder and Exhibitor.

Premier Exhibitor defined - The individual who is housing the animal, with verification provided by an Official Health Certificate and/or Official DHI Sheet, will be considered the exhibitor for tabulation of Premier Exhibitor Points.

Owner Breeder defined - The individual whose prefix appears on the Registry Certificate shall be considered the Breeder of the animal for tabulation of Premier Breeder Points.

Partnership or Syndicate Ownership - Regardless of ownership, Premier Exhibitor Points will be awarded to the individual who is housing the animal. Pertaining to Premier Breeder, all points will be awarded to the Prefix. There will be no splitting of Premier Breeder and/or Exhibitor Points.

District II Jersey Show

A District II Jersey Show will be held **Tuesday, July 26, 2011 at 6:00 PM.**

1. The District II Jersey Show is sponsored by Cumberland Valley Jersey Breeders.
2. All classes same as regular Fair Classes except there will be an Intermediate Champion in the Open Class only.
3. **The Lester Martin Memorial Award** – will be presented to the Youth who owns the animal with the highest milk, fat, and protein record for the last full lactation (305 days). Nominations should be given to a Dairy Committee member at check-in or **by 12:00 Noon on Monday, July 25, 2011.**

Requirements:

- a. Animal must be owned and shown by the exhibitor at the District II Jersey Show.
- b. Winner will be selected by the District II Jersey Show Committee Members.
- c. Youth are considered ages 8 to 21 as of January 1st.
- d. Must have life history sheet.

Holstein Show

The South Central Championship Holstein Show will be held on **Friday, July 29, 2011 at 6:00 PM.**

1. The South Central Championship Holstein Show is sponsored by the Pennsylvania Holstein Association.
2. All classes follow the same format as regular Fair Classes.
3. Junior exhibitors wishing to receive any Pennsylvania Holstein award must be a Junior member of the Pennsylvania Junior Holstein Association. Applications to join the Pennsylvania Holstein Association will be available the day of the show.
