Rules & Regulation of Premiums and Exhibits

By entering an item or animal for exhibit, the person exhibiting said item agrees to abide by the following general rules and procedures. Failure to do so may result in forfeiture of premiums and possible removal from the fairgrounds.

In addition, the exhibitor and his/her exhibit(s) must comply with all health and department/section-specific rules listed under the appropriate headings in this Premium Book.

General Rules & Regulations

1. Exhibit space must be paid in full by the dates listed in each department.
2. All expense of transportation and transfer to the space allotted must be paid by the owner. The Association cordially invites dealers to exhibit their products.
3. All articles on exhibit must be respected as private property and any person detected in purloining or injuring them will be dealt with according to law.
4. This Association assumes no responsibility in cases of loss or damage to stock or other exhibits, from any cause. In case anyone is injured, the privilege renter or exhibitor shall assume all responsibility, therefore, and shall indemnify the Fair for any and all expenses occasioned by such an accident or injury.
5. Exhibitors are required to give personal attention to their property and animals and at the close of the Fair to see to their removal; only on this condition are entries received and the Association will not assume any liability for personal injury sustained by any person entering the grounds. All persons renting privileges upon the ground and all exhibitors of livestock, machinery, etc., must so attend to their removal as the Association will not assume further responsibility.
6. A penalty will be imposed on exhibitors who knowingly exhibit diseased stock.
7. No disorderly conduct of any kind will be permitted. A police force will be upon the grounds to prevent inappropriate behavior and see that all rules and regulations are strictly observed.
8. The management appreciates all courtesies from members of the press, local and from other town and cities, and will be glad to meet with any who may find it convenient to attend the Fair. Admission will be cheerfully furnished to publishers, editors and chosen representatives presenting proper credentials to the office.
9. The Fair Association will not be responsible for typographical errors.
10. No alcoholic beverages, drugs, or other controlled substances are permitted on the fairgrounds by the public, workers or entertainers. Exhibitors using alcohol will have their premium money withheld and their exhibit will be sent home.
11. Anyone not exhibiting livestock at the Fair will not be permitted on the fairgrounds between midnight and 6:00 AM unless they have a special permit from the fair office.
12. Livestock and Dairy trailers and trucks being parked on the fairgrounds during the week should be parked at the west end of the lot beyond the tractor pull area (Gate 7).

LIVESTOCK RULES AND REGULATIONS

Information in addition to RULES & REGULATIONS OF PREMIUMS AND EXHIBITS:

1. Entry blanks can be secured from the Department Chairman or Livestock Superintendent: Lois Zeigler, 106 Carlisle Road, Newville, PA 17241. Entry blanks are also available on the Shippensburg Community Fair web site at <http://www.shippensburgfair.com>.
2. Entries must be sent to the Department Chairman on or before **June 1, 2011**. Exhibitor's date of birth **MUST** be listed on entry form for showmanship entries. **Any livestock entries received from June 2 thru June 15 will be charged double entry fee. NO entries will be accepted after June 15, 2011.** The Fair Association and Livestock Committee have the right to accept or reject any or all entries.
3. Beef, Sheep, Goat, Swine, and Rabbit exhibitors - Because of limited pen space, Cumberland and Franklin County breeders will receive preference for available space.
4. Entries in market classes and breeding goats are open to 4-H and FFA members of Cumberland and Franklin counties only. Animals must be carried in approved record books. All record books must be verified prior to the fair.
5. Market animals must have an official county FFA or 4-H ear tag in place prior to arrival. All other eartags **MUST** be removed prior to arrival (except official USDA/APHIS eartags). **Franklin County market animals must have a numbered white eartag, minimum size 1 ½ inch.**
6. All breeding animals must be registered and identified by official eartag or tattoo (see 4-H & FFA exception below). Junior breeding animals must be registered in the junior exhibitor's name (no animal registered in farm or parent's names, or joint ownership will be accepted in the junior breeding classes) and identified by official eartag or tattoo. Copies of registration papers must accompany show entry forms for breeding goats. Original registration papers must accompany animals to the fair and be checked by the Department Chairman.
7. All goats and sheep for exhibition must be identified with an official USDA Scrapie identification. Scrapie tag must be in place prior to arrival.
8. Only 4-H and FFA members are eligible to show crossbred animals in the breeding show provided that these animals are carried in approved record books (these crossbred animals are not required to have registration papers)
9. No entry fee for group classes – All animals in group classes must be entered in and shown in individual classes unless no qualifying class exists. Exhibitors are limited to 1 entry for each group class.
10. In the event of no competition in any class, the judge will decide by merit the placement of the animal.
11. An exhibitor may receive a maximum of 2 premiums in any one class.
12. Market Steers, Market Goats, Market Lambs, Market Swine cannot arrive before 8:00 AM on Sunday, July 24, 2011. Anyone unloading before that time or before the animals are checked by a committee member will be sent home and cannot compete in the 2011 Fair. Market animals must be on the Fairgrounds by 12:00 PM on Sunday July 24, 2011 and will not be released until 9:00 pm on Tuesday, July 26, 2011. Exhibitors removing their animals before publicized release time will forfeit all premiums.
13. 4-H Feeder Calves, Breeding Beef Cattle, Breeding Goats, and Breeding Sheep will be checked in at Windmill Market and Auction, 42 W. Orange Street, Shippensburg starting at 8:00 AM on Wednesday, July 27, 2011. Rabbits will be checked before unloading at the Fairgrounds starting at 8:00 AM on Wednesday July 27, 2011. Anyone unloading before the animals are checked by a committee member will be sent home and cannot compete in the 2011 Fair.
14. Breeding animals must be on the Fairgrounds by 1:00 PM on Wednesday, July 27 2011 and will not

be released until 12:00 PM on Saturday, July 30, 2011.

15. Mandatory exhibitors meeting will be held in the Show Arena at 12:15 PM on Sunday, July 24, 2011.
16. Market Steers, Market Goats, Market Lambs and Market Swine will be weighed Sunday, July 24, 2011 beginning at approximately 9:00 a.m. All market classes will then be determined. 4-H Feeder calves will be weighed at 1:00 p.m. on Wednesday, July 27, 2011 and then all classes will be determined.
17. All Exhibitors are encouraged to use the enclosed "Biosecurity Checklist for Livestock Exhibitor" Form.
18. The Livestock Committee will assign pens and stall placing. Any exhibitor not complying with designated assignments without prior approval of the proper department chairman shall have the option of moving to the assigned area or leave the grounds and forfeit any entry fees paid for exhibition.
19. Pen size for sheep, swine, and goats is 6' x 6'. All assigned pens and stalls shall be kept in a neat and presentable condition at all times. Failure to comply may result in forfeiture of your premiums
20. All pens must be cleaned before leaving the Fairgrounds. All manure must be placed in a designated area and all pens must be reset and tied as you found them. A release form signed by the Livestock Committee must be presented before receiving an exhibitor check upon departure. Exhibitors who do not comply will forfeit their premiums
21. No hay or bedding will be provided by the Fair Association. The only bedding permitted to be used on the grounds will be straw or corncobs. No carpet, wood shavings, peanut hulls or saw dust of any kind may be used!
22. Be sure to use only grooming products that are approved for use on meat and dairy animals when fitting your animals for show. Unapproved products may contain ingredients that result in unacceptable residues in the meat or milk. If you are not certain that a product is residue safe and approved for use on meat or dairy animals, do not use it. *** **Important***** If upon slaughter, treatment with drugs, biologics or any chemical from fitting products, is the cause of condemnation of a carcass, the loss of the carcass and any other damages will be borne by exhibitor.
23. Each exhibitor is encouraged to display signs and ribbons.
24. The Homeland Security Regulations for Community and County Fairs require open access to all buildings on the Fairgrounds. Due to these new requirements, there will be no parking of vehicles around the livestock barns during the week of the Fair.
25. No generators may be operated until the conclusion of the market goat and market lamb show on Monday without the prior approval of the Livestock Superintendent or his/her designee.
26. A livestock show exhibitor shall be responsible for the continuous care, including access to water at all times, grooming and preparation of the livestock entered in the livestock show.
27. All junior exhibitors are required to show their own animals unless a written excuse is presented and approved by the livestock superintendent prior to the show.
28. Hogs cannot be clipped or shaved. This includes ears, tails and bellies. Hogs will be checked at show time and will not be allowed to show if clipped or shaved. All decisions will be at the discretion of the Swine Department.
29. In the Market Division ribbons will be given based on open class placings only. Champion rosette ribbons will be given based on 4-H and FFA placings only.
30. In the Breeding Division, ribbons will be given based on open class placings only.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:

Pennsylvania requires that a "Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship" exist, and that it be verified in writing for each exhibitor. This requirement is in addition to all pre-existing Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. To meet this requirement, a signed verification from the animal owner or caretaker, using the enclosed "Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship" must be completed by each exhibitor. Upon arrival at the Fair Grounds, a completed and signed "Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship Form" must be turned in to the Department Chairman. Each animal to be exhibited must be listed on the form or be listed on an extra copy of The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection attached to the "Relationship Form".

Department 3 - Beef Cattle

Information in addition to Livestock Rules and Regulations:

1. Entry fee is \$2.50 per head in all open classes.
2. Entries MUST be sent to Department Chairman, Sherisa Nailor, Big Spring High School, 100 Mt. Rock Road, Newville, PA 17241 on or before June 1st. Any livestock entries received from June 2 thru June 15 will be charged double entry fee. NO entries will be accepted after June 15, 2011.
3. There will be a duplicate show of all classes for 4-H and FFA Members in all divisions.
4. Steers are not permitted to show in any breeding class.

Health Rules and Regulations:

1. NO BRUCELLOSIS OR TUBERCULOSIS TESTS ARE REQUIRED.
2. **VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS:** All entries shall be accompanied by "Certificate of Veterinary Inspection" (CVI) signed by an accredited veterinarian issued after May 12011 that includes a statement that the animal(s) identified have been immunized against IBR, PI3 and BVD, using at least 2 doses of killed vaccine, 2-4 weeks apart, or 1 dose of Modified Live Vaccine (MLV). The most recent vaccine must be administered not less than 30 days or more than 180 days before the opening day of the fair.
3. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older (market cattle are exempt from this vaccination requirement). All vaccine label directions must be followed, and all rabies vaccinated cattle must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate or the vaccination information must be included on the CVI. If a rabies vaccination certificate is provided, the certificate must contain the legible name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine and the veterinarian's signature. A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable.

Health Rules and Regulations:

1. All sheep must bear an official USDA/APHIS eartag to be exhibited at the show. Sheep from flocks on the voluntary scrapie program must bear the official eartag, tattoo, or electronic ear implant.
2. To qualify, all animals must be free of any evidence of transmissible disease, including external parasites, sore mouth, and foot rot, and be clearly identified on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) of the state of origin. An accredited veterinarian must prepare the CVI issued after May 1, 2011. A copy of the CVI must accompany the sheep to the show and be available for inspection at all times during the show as additional inspections of sheep health certificates will be made.
 - a. Identification – Purebred animals must be identified by registry name and number, corresponding to the ear tag or tattoo number. Crossbreed animals must be identified by farm-flock number, corresponding to the ear tag or tattoo number.
 - b. Flock Inspection – Flocks must be examined after May 1, 2011. The veterinarian who has examined the entries and the flocks from which they come must certify on the health certificate that she/he has found no evidence of transmissible disease and to the best of her/his knowledge, no exposure thereto, and are not subject to any quarantine restrictions.
3. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older (market sheep are exempt from this vaccination requirement). All vaccine label directions must be followed, and all rabies vaccinated sheep must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate or the vaccination information must be included on the CVI. If a rabies vaccination certificate is provided, the

certificate must contain the legible name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine and the veterinarian's signature. A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable.

- Judging will take place daily and will be unannounced.
- Market livestock judging will take place:
 - Sunday from 12:00 Noon – 9:00 PM
 - Monday from 8:00 AM – 9:00 PM
 - Tuesday from 8:00 AM – 5:00 PM
- Breeding livestock judging will take place:
 - Wednesday from 5:00 PM – 9:00 PM
 - Thursday from 8:00 AM – 9:00 PM
 - Friday from 8:00 AM – 9:00 PM

Judging will include the following:

- 30 points - Cleanliness of animals and bedding
- 20 points - Entry card and ribbons properly displayed
- 10 points - Keeping grain and hay presentable
- 15 points - Keeping aisles clean
- 15 points - Courtesy to people

Scores will be added up at the conclusion of each market and breeding stay. Ribbons will be awarded daily. There will be a 1st, 2nd and 3rd place award given to breeding and market winners.

Department 10 - 4-H and FFA

Junior Livestock

Information in addition to Livestock Rules and Regulations:

1. **ELIGIBILITY:** Competition in this division is limited to 4-H and FFA members currently enrolled in Cumberland & Franklin Counties. Animals exhibited must be part of a project carried in an approved record book. Each breeding animal must be registered in the name of the junior exhibitor (no animal registered in farm or parent's names will be accepted in the junior breeding classes). Registration papers are not required for crossbreed animals). No farm name, parent's name or joint ownership is permitted!
2. There is no entry fee for the Junior Livestock classes.
3. Use standard entry form and mark appropriate boxes, complete necessary information and mail to the Department Chairman listed in the open department.
4. Each junior exhibitor is encouraged to enter open classes.

ROBERT L. FINKENBINDER FFA MARKET ANIMAL SALE RULES:

1. **ELIGIBILITY:** Only animals carried as FFA projects in Cumberland County are eligible to be sold in this sale.
2. This sale is under the direction of the Cumberland County FFA Advisors and their decisions are final.
3. Each FFA exhibitor must present an up-to-date record book at the Fair verifying the projects which he/she plans to sell. Animals not verified by their project records will be denied the opportunity to sell. All students must earn a minimum of 100 points (200 possible) in each species that was sold in last year's fair in order to be eligible to sell at the Shippensburg Community Fair in 2011. There will be no exceptions and students will not have the opportunity to "get a better score".
4. Each exhibitor who sells in the sale is expected to help set up the sale area and dismantle the sale area. In addition, each exhibitor is expected to help load his or her animals after the sale. Failure to comply with this rule could result in a charge deducted from your sale check.
5. Each member may sell up to two (2) animals of each species in the sale.
6. A thank you letter to the buyer of each animal sold is an essential element to the continued success of the sale. An acceptable, typed or legibility handwritten, accurate, and grammatically correct letter of thanks from the exhibitor (1 for each animal sold) must be presented to his/her Ag teacher before payment will be released.
7. **MARKET ANIMALS:** Animals consigned for slaughter during or immediately following the show shall not receive any treatment with drugs or biologics within the withdrawal time prior to slaughter. Withdrawal times for drugs and biologics are all stated on the directions for use. Label directions must be followed at all times.
8. **QUALITY ASSURANCE:** All FFA Members who participate in the Market Animal Sale must be trained and certified in a meat animal Quality Assurance Program. The Exhibitor's Quality Assurance Certification number must be included with the entries.
9. Exhibitors are encouraged to have market animals at the proper market weight.

Section x99 - Showing & Fitting Contests

1. In each of the four species, market and breeding, there will be a showmanship & fitting competition. This competition will consist of approximately 70% showmanship and 30% fitting (this scale is at the discretion of the judge). Note: Market Beef showmanship and fitting classes will include market beef, dairy beef and FFA feeder calves. Breeding Beef showmanship and fitting classes will include breeding beef, and 4-H feeder calves.
2. ELIGIBILITY: Competition in showmanship is limited to 4-H and FFA members currently enrolled in Cumberland and Franklin counties.
3. Exhibitor age is determined as of Sunday, the opening day of the fair. Date of birth MUST be listed on entry form.
4. Each exhibitor must use his/her own animal in this competition.
5. Exhibitors competing for Grand Champion Showman must use the same animal that was used in previous Showmanship class.
6. The Livestock Committee reserves the right to split the classes due to class size.
7. The winner in each class will receive a special award. The Country Butcher Shop sponsors the awards in the market divisions for all four species. The breeding divisions awards are sponsored as follows:
 Sheep – Keith's Farm & Dairy and F & M Trust Goats - Venture Valley Farm
8. Showmanship classes follow the show order: Senior, Junior, Intermediate and Novice, Grand Champion

Sections 1-17 - Rabbits

DEPARTMENT 9

Judge: Valerie Mayle

1. Entries may be sent to Department Chairman, Mike Woods, 2 Mary Avenue, Mechanicsburg, PA 17055 on or before June 1st. Any rabbit entries received from June 2 thru June 15 will be charged double entry fee. NO entries will be accepted after June 15, 2011.
2. Entry fee is \$0.50 per head and must accompany entries.
3. This is an open rabbit show. However, cage space may be limited. In the event there are more entries than cage space, preference will be given to 4-H and FFA members of Cumberland and Franklin Counties. Also, exhibitor restrictions on number of entries exhibited may be implemented. Double premiums will not be paid to youth entries. Please note if showing a 4-H or FFA project, you must have an approved project book.
4. Rabbits will be checked before unloading at the Fairgrounds starting at 8:00 AM on Wednesday, July 27, 2011. Anyone unloading before the animals are checked by a committee member will be sent home and cannot compete in the 2011 Shippensburg Fair.
5. Exhibitors must have all rabbits on the fairgrounds by 1:00 PM on Wednesday, July 27, 2011. No rabbit may leave the fair prior to 12:00 PM on Saturday, July 30, 2011.
6. No rabbit showing clinical signs of contagious or infectious disease or of an unhealthy nature will be eligible for display and competition. The Chair reserves the right to bar any entry that does not appear to be of a healthy nature.
7. While this is not an American Rabbit Breeders Association (ARBA) show, and their rules do not apply, the judge will use the breed guidelines outlined in the ARBA Standard of Perfection in his/her placings. Animals with ARBA disqualifications will not be disqualified, but may receive a lower merit.
8. Rabbits will be shown by breed. However, breeds will not be broken down by variety.
9. No rabbit may compete in more than one class. Exhibitors are limited to two entries per class.
10. Exhibitors must supply fresh feed and water for their entry daily. Cages need to be cleaned as well. Final cage cleaning approved by the chair must be completed before a fair check will be issued.
11. Exhibitors must supply a lock (or suitable devise to secure cage door) for their cage during the Fair. In addition, a key for the lock must be presented to the Chair to be kept in the Livestock Office for emergencies.
12. Class winners and overall breed winners will receive ribbons and/or rosettes provided by the Shippensburg Community fair. Additional awards and their sponsors for showmanship and the breed classes will be announced at the show. Anyone wishing to sponsor an award should contact the Chair.
13. It is encouraged that all rabbit entries are tattooed in their left ear. However, rabbits not tattooed will have a designation placed in their ear by the chair with a sharpie marker prior to judging.
14. Rabbits do not require a veterinarian health certificate, but a "Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship Form" must be submitted with each animal listed separately when you check your entry in with the chair.

Section 18 - Meat Pen

DEPARTMENT 9

Judge: Valerie Mayle

1. Entries are limited to 4-H and FFA members in Cumberland and Franklin counties. Entries in this class must be carried as projects in approved record books.
2. A meat pen consists of three rabbits of the same breed. These rabbits should be tattooed in the left ear. They may be up to ten weeks old (70 days maximum) and must weigh a minimum of three pounds and a maximum of 5 pounds individually. Animals should be uniform.
3. Each exhibitor is limited to one rabbit meat pen. In preparation for the fair, up to ten rabbits may be tattooed. However, only three will be presented at the fair for evaluation.
4. Owner should notify chair their intent to enter a meat pen before the doe is bred. The chair will advise their FFA advisor or 4-H leader in making sure animals are properly tattooed and meet competition guidelines.
5. Award winning meat pens will not be sold at the 2010 Shippensburg Fair.
6. These rabbits cannot be shown in the breed classes, although the sire or dam can be entered in the breed classes.

Rabbit Skillathon

This contest is limited to Cumberland and Franklin County 4-H and FFA members. While you must be caring a rabbit project in either county, you do not need to enter a rabbit at the 2011 Shippensburg Fair to compete in this contest. However, you must register for this competition on the respective entry form. The same deadlines for rabbit entries apply to this contest. Exhibitor age is determined as of Sunday, the opening day of the fair. Date of birth must be included on the entry form.

Total number of points will be based on 100 point scale. Participants will rotate through the five stations. Complexity or number of questions may vary based on age division

The participants will be judged on their knowledge within the following categories:

Project Book/Interview Station (15 points) - Is your project book up to date? Your project book will be reviewed, so make sure you bring it along. Students may also be asked to site the 4-H Pledge and Motto or FFA Motto depending on what organization they belong to. You will also be asked no more than five questions about your project.

Rabbit Showmanship (30 points)

1. Exhibitors will meet with the judge and be scored individually. If a participant is an exhibitor, they may use their own entry. For those who are not exhibitors, they will use a rabbit provided by the chair. The score will be based on the following: carrying the rabbit to the table; posing; checking ears, teeth, eyes and nose; checking toenails, hocks, front feet, abdomen, legs, and tail; checking sex; checking fur; the exhibitor's appearance, actions and knowledge. Exhibitor's knowledge will

- be tested by answering questions related to the breed exhibited, diseases, and standard management practices. The exhibitor is not restricted to a specific order for the presentation.
- Blank score sheets are available from the Department Chairman, PaSRBA Board Members, or online at <http://www.shippensburgfair.com>.
 - Exhibitors will show in proper attire, which includes a long-sleeved top and long pants.

Feeding/Feedstuff Identification (15 points) - Make sure you are shined up on your hays and grains. Be prepared to explain a feed bag label.

Rabbitry Management (10 points) - There will be a written test on common diseases and the management of your rabbitry to prevent these diseases. You may be given a piece of poster board and some markers and asked to do an educational poster on proper animal housing, care, pen sanitation, or another aspect of preventative medicine. You could also be given a scenario such as preparing your rabbitry for either a cold or warm front.

Judging (30 points) - Participants will be presented with two classes of rabbits. They are to be placed first through fourth. No reasons will be necessary. Students will also be permitted to use the ARBA Standard of Perfection as a resource. Breeds used in the judging contest can be requested for chair after July 1, 2010.

Prizes:

The winner of each division will receive an award. Ribbons will be awarded through fifth place.

4-H and FFA Master Showmanship

Chairpersons: Buster Davis, Bill Haines and Mike Woods

1. The Master Showmanship Competition is for champion showman in beef, swine, sheep, goats, rabbits, and a surprise class. Exhibitors from both the Market and Breeding divisions are eligible to participate for a total of eight (8) exhibitors.
2. Showmen in these classes will show each type of livestock.
3. NOTICE: If a showman is the champion for multiple species throughout the show week, their position will not be filled by other showmen. Only master showmen will compete.
4. The entrant with the highest total score will receive the Master Showmanship Award.
5. Judges must be adults.
6. Master showmanship winners may not show their own animal.
7. To be held on Saturday, July 30th at 9:00 AM in the Livestock Show Ring.
8. Time – Each class is limited to 10 minutes with up to 5 minutes between rounds to switch animals.
9. If the situation comes up, contestants who have won showmanship with a market animal and that animal had to be loaded out, it is the Chairperson's responsibility to find another appropriate animal to show.
10. All showmen will show all species. If there is no contestant in an age group in a species, then it is up to the Superintendent to supply an appropriate animal. The additional animal must be a 4-H animal. If none are available, then an open class animal will be used; unless there are not enough animals entered in the shows.
11. The Master Showmanship Committee reserves the right to remove an animal(s) for safety reasons and replace it with another of the same species.
12. Showman Biographies – A short participant biography sheet will be handed out to each contestant; it needs to be completed BEFORE Master Showmanship. This will be read out loud to the audience. You may pick up the biography sheet at the livestock office and should do so before Friday evening of the Fair.
13. Scoring (points) – There will be a maximum of 10 points possible per rotation. Scores will run from 0 to 10 (10 highest). Judges may use half points where applicable (with 10.0 being the highest). In the event that a contestant refuses to show the specie, they will be given a score of 0. You must show the animal to get any points for that round. In the event of a tie, the committee will review the scores from all the species of the contestants and the one with the highest ranking in the most species will be the winner.

- Joe scored higher in Swine, Sheep, and Rabbits. Jane scored higher in Fiber Goats, Dairy Goats, and Llamas.

14. Scoring (Cards) – Each judge will have 1 sheet with all the contestants' numbers on it. Exhibitors will be identified by armbands or number cards on their backs.
15. How the show will run: A half an hour before the show we will have a quick Master Showmanship meeting with the contestants and their group leaders in the Livestock Ring. All participants MUST BE dressed & ready to show at that time. Attendance is required. We will go over the rules, rotation map, and answer any questions. Animals & contestants must be at ring side by NO LATER than 5 minutes before the show starts. We will rotate clockwise. Each class will have 10 minutes with up to 5 minutes to switch animals. Once the show is finished the Chairpersons will collect the score sheets & turn them into the livestock office for tabulation. During the initial rotation an MC will be reading the participant biographies. One timer will be used. Time will be called over the loud speaker. Contestants participating in Master Showmanship must stay with their group leader when moving from species to species. **There will be no talking, reviewing papers, cell phones, texting, or contact with people outside the ring.** Anyone caught not following these rules may be eliminated from the contest. It will be at the Master Showmanship Committee's discretion.
