Fair Operating Guidelines

The Fair's primary goal is to ensure the safety and equitable treatment and access to all visitors, exhibitors, volunteers, and fairgoers. To accomplish this goal, we enforce the following rules and guidelines during our events.

Fair Rules & Policies

All final decisions regarding all Shippensburg Community Fair exhibits, events or activities will be made by the Shippensburg Community Fair Executive Committee.

No alcohol, illegal drugs or fireworks will be allowed on the fairgrounds.

No pets, except service animals and properly identified service animals-in-training will be allowed anywhere on the fairgrounds. Arrangements for service animals must be made in advance and approved by safety personnel.

The right is reserved to inspect at any time exhibits, shows, concession booths, stalls, or animals at the fairgrounds.

Exhibitors and volunteers over 18 years of age grant permission to the Shippensburg Community Fair to use their name, likeness, voice and words in television, radio, films, newspapers, magazines, and other media and in any form, not heretofore describe for the lawful purpose and activities of the Shippensburg Community Fair. Exhibitors and volunteers understand that they will not receive any compensation for the use of their name or likeness.

General Guidelines & Rules

These rules apply to all departments, events, exhibits and activities. All exhibitors must read and agree to abide by these general rules.

1. The Shippensburg Community Fair will not be responsible for any loss, damage or accident that may occur to any person, animal, article or vehicle, but will take every reasonable precaution to safeguard same.
2. All entries must be made in the name of the bona fide owner. Entries made otherwise will not be allowed to compete.
3. The Fair reserves the right to refuse any item considered unsuitable to exhibit.
4. The decision of the judges is final.
5. Any exhibitor who publicly expresses disapproval of the judge's decision, or who is guilty of conduct unbecoming of an exhibitor will be excluded from all exhibitions. His/her premiums will be forfeited, and he/she will be excused from the fairgrounds.
6. No premiums will be paid on exhibits in classes not listed in the Exhibitor's Premium Book.
7. In case of only one entry competing for the premium, judges will determine prize and ribbon to be awarded.
8. Premiums will not be paid on any item removed from the Fair before the designated release date/time.
9. Any exhibit that is not picked up by Fair release date/time listed in the Exhibitor's Premium Book will become the property of the Fair.
10. The right is reserved to inspect at any time exhibits, shows, concessions booths, stalls, or animals on the fairgrounds.
11. No loitering on Shippensburg Community Fair property.
12. No solicitation allowed on Shippensburg Community Fair property.
13. Wearing of masks, hoods or any items that obstruct the viewing of the face is prohibited.
14. Games of chance must follow state guidelines in accordance with the rules for playing games of chance. All violations will be turned over to the Pennsylvania Gaming Commission. If an individual or organization is caught breaking the state laws or guidelines in reference to games of chance, the organization's stand or booth will be shut down for the day of the Fair. If caught a second time, the stand or booth will be shut down for the remainder of the Fair.
15. No fighting is allowed on the Shippensburg Fairgrounds at any time. Those involved will be escorted off the fairgrounds and will not be permitted back on the property for the rest of the evening. Those caught a second time will not be permitted on the property for the remainder of the Fair. Repeat offenders will be arrested for trespassing.
16. No bicycles or skateboards are permitted on Fair property. Any bicycles brought onto the fairgrounds must be parked inside Gate #1 along the fence. The Shippensburg Community Fair is not responsible for any bicycle brought to the Fair.
17. **No alcohol of any kind is permitted on the property.** Anyone found with alcohol will be removed from the fairgrounds immediately and all premiums forfeited.
18. No trespassing is permitted on the Shippensburg Fairgrounds property.
19. No parking is permitted around any buildings or unauthorized parking areas on the Fairgrounds. Violators may be towed at the owner's expense.
20. All vendors and food concession stands must follow guidelines established in reference to the delivery of

- food, supplies, and other items for the operation of their stand.
21. No running or horseplay is permitted.
 22. No firearms, knives, clubs, or other weapons are allowed on Shippensburg Fairgrounds property with the exception of authorized law enforcement personnel.
 23. All vendors must break down and take all cardboard to the designated dumpster or recycling area at the end of the food stands for proper disposal.
 24. No vehicles with the intention of tearing down vendor booths or stands will be permitted on the Fairgrounds on Saturday night until 11:00 PM (subject to change).
 25. Any violation of the above rules will result in an expulsion from the fairgrounds. The length of said expulsion may vary based on the severity of the violation. If an individual or organization violates Pennsylvania State Law, the proper law enforcement agency will be contacted. Any decision for expulsion will be made by the Security & Safety Committee. Anyone expelled may appeal this decision to a three-member panel consisting of the Fair Board President (or his/her designee), a member of the Security & Safety Committee, and a Fair Board member at large. Any decision of this panel is final.

Rules & Regulations of Premiums and Exhibits

By entering an item or animal for exhibit, the person exhibiting said item agrees to abide by the following general rules and procedures. Failure to do so may result in forfeiture of premiums and possible removal from the fairgrounds. In addition, the exhibitor and his/her exhibit(s) must comply with all health and department/section-specific rules listed under the appropriate headings in this Premium Book.

General Rules & Regulations of Exhibits

1. Exhibit space must be paid in full by the dates listed in each department.
2. All expense of transportation and transfer to the space allotted must be paid by the owner.
3. All articles on exhibit must be respected as private property and any person detected in purloining or injuring them will be dealt with according to law.
4. This Shippensburg Community Fair assumes no responsibility in cases of loss or damage to stock or other exhibits, from any cause. In case anyone is injured, the privilege renter or exhibitor shall assume all responsibility, therefore, and shall indemnify the Fair for any and all expenses occasioned by such an accident or injury.
5. Exhibitors are required to give personal attention to their property and animals and at the close of the Fair to see to their removal; only on this condition are entries received and the Fair will not assume any liability for personal injury sustained by any person entering the grounds. All persons renting privileges upon the ground and all exhibitors of livestock, machinery, etc., must so attend to their removal as the Fair will not assume further responsibility.
6. A penalty will be imposed on exhibitors who knowingly exhibit diseased stock.
7. No disorderly conduct of any kind will be permitted. A police force will be upon the grounds to prevent inappropriate behavior and see that all rules and regulations are strictly observed.
8. The management appreciates all courtesies from members of the press, local and from other town and cities, and will be glad to meet with any who may find it convenient to attend the Fair. Admission will be cheerfully furnished to publishers, editors and chosen representatives presenting proper credentials to the office.
9. The Fair will not be responsible for typographical errors.
10. **No alcoholic beverages**, drugs, or other controlled substances are permitted on the fairgrounds. Exhibitors using alcohol will be removed from the fairgrounds immediately with all premiums forfeited.
11. Anyone not exhibiting livestock at the Fair will not be permitted on the fairgrounds between midnight and 6:00 AM unless they have special permission from the Fair Office.
12. Livestock and Dairy trailers and trucks being parked on the fairgrounds during the week should be parked at the west end of the lot beyond the tractor pull area (Gate 10).

DAIRY DEPARTMENT

Dairy Cattle Health Rules

The Shippensburg Community Fair has designated Dr. Levi Smith as the official Fair veterinarian.

IMPORTANT: ALL HEALTH PAPERS MUST BE CHECKED BEFORE UNLOADING.

Absolutely no drenching of any animals. Violators will be asked to leave the grounds immediately and will forfeit all premiums.

Be sure to use only grooming products that are approved for use on meat and dairy animals when fitting your animals for show. Unapproved products may contain ingredients that result in unacceptable residues in the meat or milk. If you are not certain that a product is residue safe and approved for use on meat or dairy animals **do not use it!** **Important! - If upon slaughter, treatment with drugs, biologics or any chemical from fitting products is the cause of condemnation of a carcass, the loss of the carcass and any other damages will be borne by the exhibitor.**

HEALTH CERTIFICATION

No animal showing evidence of contagious, infectious, or external parasitic disease shall be allowed entrance into the show. All animals must be accompanied by an approved Health Certificate and bear unique permanent identification. The base date for computing health rules will be the opening day of the show. Animals will not be admitted without the necessary health papers. Health Certificate must be available at all times as additional inspections of Health Certificates will be made.

ALL CATTLE MUST HAVE AN OFFICIAL EARTAG OR OFFICIAL TATOO. All animals must have appropriate RFID Tag. A 15-digit animal identification number ear tag starting with 840, 124. Other ID approved by PDA (brands and bred registrations with tattoos not acceptable).

PENNSYLVANIA CATTLE

No Tuberculosis test is required – No Brucellosis test is required.

VACCINATION REQUIREMENT

All cattle must be accompanied by a health certificate, signed by an accredited veterinarian, that includes a statement that the animals(s) identified have been immunized against IBR, P13, and BVD. Animals that have never been vaccinated against BVD or have not been vaccinated against BVD during the previous 12 months must receive one dose of modified live virus vaccine given at least 15 days, and not more than 180 days before the show, or two doses of killed vaccine, two to four weeks apart, with the last dose given at least 15 days and not more than 180 days before the show. Animals that have been vaccinated against BVD within the previous 12 months must receive at least a single injection of modified live virus or killed vaccine given not less than 15 days and not more than 180 days before the show. **IMPORTANT: The date of the last live virus vaccination or the dates of the last two killed virus vaccinations must be recorded on the Health Certificate.** Hyper immune serum may not be used as a substitute for the above vaccination requirement. No animals will be admitted to the show unless these requirements have been met.

RABIES VACCINATION REQUIREMENT

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!

A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for animals 3 months of age or older. All vaccine label directions must be followed, and all rabies vaccinated cattle must be accompanied by a rabies vaccine certificate or the vaccination information must be included on the CVI. If a rabies vaccination certificate is provided, the certificate must contain legible name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine and the veterinarian's signature. A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable.

OUT- OF- STATE CATTLE

An interstate health certificate recording the required tests and stating the animals have not been exposed to any infectious, contagious, or parasitic disease shall be signed by an accredited veterinarian approved by the State Veterinarian of the state of origin and forwarded to the Pennsylvania Bureau of Animal Health and Diagnostic Services. **TUBERCULOSIS REQUIREMENTS** – A tuberculosis test is required. **BRUCELLOSIS REQUIREMENTS** – No test is required for animals originating from states classified as Brucellosis Free and animals originating from Class A, B or C states should call (717) 783-9550 for current interstate brucellosis test requirements.

Dairy Cattle Rules

1. All applications for entry must be made on printed forms with payment of entry fee and mailed to John Ocker III, 770 Mud Level Road, Shippensburg, PA 17257, no later than **July 1, 2024**. No additional entries will be accepted after this date. All breeds are limited to a total of 200 stalls for beginning of week and 200 stalls at end of week. **Entries will be accepted on a first-received basis.** All applications received and accepted by the committee will receive a Letter of Acceptance. **Entry fee \$6.00 per animal. Any questions, please call John Ocker III at [H] 717-532-4534, [C] 717-446-1089.**
2. The Shippensburg Community Fair and Dairy Committee have the right to accept or reject any or all entries.
3. **Stall Assignments – Three stalls will be given to every two cows. Due to space limitations, in the barns, it will be at the discretion of the Dairy Committee whether to allow fitting chutes inside the barns.**
4. **Scratch Fee – a \$25 scratch fee will be assessed to exhibitors that fail to scratch before the scratch deadline. All scratch fees are due prior to the receipt of Shippensburg Fair premium checks. All animals scratched after the deadline, July 15, 2024, will be subject to the \$25 scratch fee if a veterinary excuse is not provided to the Dairy Committee. All stalls will be assigned on July 20, 2024 – any special requests must be made before this date.**
5. **Substitution Rule – An exhibitor is permitted to substitute any animal for another within the same breed. Substitution can be a cow for a calf or vice versa.**
6. Certification of Registration must be in exhibitor's name and available to show management when animals are checked into the show. If Certificate of Registry is not in the exhibitor's name at the time of the show, then the animal may be eligible to be shown if a signed transfer with payment attached when animals are checked into the show.
7. All feed, bedding, and necessary utensils for proper care of animals shall be provided by the exhibitor.
8. All assigned stalls and animals shall be kept in a neat and presentable condition at all times. Failure to comply will result in forfeiture of premium money.
9. Any exhibitor displaying disorderly conduct or using alcohol on the fairgrounds will be dismissed from the Fair and premiums withheld.
10. When there is only one animal in any class, the Judges may, at their discretion, award a prize of such grade as the animal deserves.
11. While the Shippensburg Community Fair will do everything in its power to protect animals on exhibit, they will not be responsible for injuries incurred.

Special Rules

1. Jersey, Guernsey and Milking Shorthorn shall be in their assigned stall by 12:00 Noon on Sunday, July 21. Jersey, Guernsey and Milking Shorthorn animals are permitted to be unloaded any time after 8:00 AM on Sunday, July 21. All Ayrshire, Red & White, Brown Swiss and Holstein cattle must arrive before 12:00 Noon on Wednesday, July 24.
2. Judging of Milking Shorthorn and Guernsey cattle is scheduled for 10:00 AM on Tuesday, July 23, the Jersey Show will begin at 6:00 PM on Tuesday, July 23. On Friday July 26, the judging of Brown Swiss, Ayrshire, Red & White cattle will be at 10:00 AM, and the Holstein Show will commence at 6:30 PM. The show will run continuously. There will be no set time for the Milking classes.
3. Red and White exhibitors must designate on the entry forms the show (Holstein or Red & White) in which they want to participate during the Shippensburg Fair. Red & White animals will be not eligible for both shows.
4. Jerseys, Guernseys, and Milking Shorthorns will be released after the completion of the Jersey Show on Tuesday, July 23, and must be off the grounds by 12:00 Midnight. Holstein, Ayrshire, Red & White, and Brown Swiss exhibitors will be permitted to start bedding preparation at 1:00 AM on Wednesday, July 24. All Brown Swiss, Ayrshire, Red & White, and Holsteins will be released at the conclusion of the Holstein Show on Friday, July 26, and must be off the grounds by 9:00 AM on Saturday, July 27.
5. Exhibitors must have their animals at ringside for the show in a timely manner to keep the show on time. Failure to comply will result in forfeiture of premium money.
6. Any exhibitor living outside Cumberland or Franklin counties may leave one hour early at the discretion of the Show Chairman.
7. All exhibitors must clean up outside in front of their assigned stalls before departing. Satisfactory work must be done.

9. **A Youth exhibitor is defined as any exhibitor 8 years old and under the age of 21 as of January 1st of the calendar year, and a current member of 4-H, FFA, or any breed youth organization. Please put youth's age on entry blank.**
10. All Youth members must designate on the entry blank all animals that will be shown as Youth. All Youth animals exhibited are eligible to receive premiums for all animals entered in Youth. The Dairy Committee asks that all Youth animals be shown by Youth members and also in the championship classes.
11. All Youth animals will be judged in conjunction with open classes.
12. Youth animals will be entered in both open and Youth.
13. Anyone not exhibiting livestock at the Fair will not be permitted on the grounds between 12:00 Midnight and 6:00 AM, unless they have special permission from the Fair Office.
14. Livestock and Dairy trailers and trucks being parked on the fairgrounds during the week should be parked at the west end of the lot beyond the tractor pull area (Gate 10).
15. Prize money and points toward Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor Awards will be limited to two (2) animals per class per exhibitor.
16. Parking passes will be limited to no more than two (2) passes per exhibitor, with not more than three (3) per family. Distribution of passes will be given at the discretion of the Dairy Committee Chairman.
17. **After the show chairman has announced the catalog as official for each show, there will be no corrections or changes made to the show catalog.**
18. **THE FAIR WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR TYPOGRAPHICAL ERRORS.**
19. **Dairy exhibitors are kindly asked to accommodate the Dairy Committee during the clean-up effort Tuesday night after the show. Please move show equipment clear of the skid loader path. Also, please tie animals on the outside of the barn rail or in the wash rack if late truck arrival is hindering the cleaning process.**

ALL EXHIBITORS are advised to put manure in designated areas. NO NEWSPAPER BEDDING, SAWDUST, OR SHAVINGS.

ALL EXHIBITORS are reminded that strings, bags, trash and other items that are trash are not to be put in manure piles.

ALL EXHIBITORS are asked to clean up in front of their assigned stalls before departing the Fairgrounds. Satisfactory work is expected.

Premier Awards
